Dear NLU Students and Alumni,

Thanks to a grant from A Better Chicago, Roosevelt University created the Metropolitan Chicago Tutoring Corps (MCTC) in collaboration with Chicago Public Schools (CPS). Corps members provide paid, high-dosage tutoring during the school day in reading and literacy to kindergarten through sixth grade students in select CPS schools during the 2024 – 25 school year.

All corps members will be employed by CPS and paid for their tutoring during the school day. CPS will pay corps members **\$20-22 an hour**. Working a minimum of 20 hours to a maximum of 30 hours per week, that's **\$400-\$700 a week!**

MCTC is open to all National Louis University undergraduate students, graduate students, and alumni! Teacher candidates enrolled in elementary education are especially encouraged to apply. All who want to help make a positive difference in the lives of our future leaders are welcome.

Acceptance into the MCTC will provide NLU students with other important benefits:

- **Specialized support and training** during the school year for the tutoring work to be completed.
- Up to \$1,000 in stipend payments to help offset expenses such as childcare and transportation.
